Dear Friends

In the midst of so much uncertainty and world-wide suffering, the Tokyo Olympics finally took place, albeit with a good deal of understandable opposition and concern. For those fortunate enough to be able to share in the excitement, it was good to have the chance to celebrate with Olympians from every sort of background as they competed for medals. For some, just being there was enough and was the summit of their sporting careers=for others Gold was the goal, and this the moment to crown their efforts with glory and public acclamation: anything less would be a disappointment. But ites not only about the individual medal winner. Again and again, medal winner had a story to tell about those who had enabled them to achieve success, with many speaking of family support, and of other figures in their childhood who had helped and inspired them, as well as the professionals ó nutritionists, physios, coaches, psychologists etc. - who had worked with them and brought them to this peak. Clearly, there is a very real and appropriate focus on one person, but that one person@s achievements are built on the herculean efforts of many: we often forget that what look like individual sports are in fact very much team affairs, just as much as õteam sportsö. And what is true for sports, is just as true for everyday life. "No man is an island, entire of itself" as John Donne put it. True for the Church, too: we proclaim in The Creed that we believe in an apostolic Church (from Greek apostolos: messenger, person sent forth). So the whole church is sent by God, just as the first apostles were. Like them, we are sent to share in his mission in and to the world, individually yet together as his body, the church. Before the pandemic, we had made very real and encouraging progress in developing the Vision for the Benefice (see below), and were starting to think about how that might be lived out at parish level via PCC Action Plans. I hope that these will begin to take shape as we move through the latter part of this year and into 2022. Beyond the constraints that Covid-19 still places upon us, and recognising that this winter may be a difficult one, we can and must look to the future: as Christians, our focus is on Christ, and he has in-

vited us to share in the work of bringing in his Kingdom.

In our parishes, we have individuals in particular roles and with particular responsibilities, but the church cange function without the whole congregation playing their part, too. As we look to the future in a changing world, we need to renew and retain our focus on the next stage of our journey as a Benefice ó a journey into Godgs future that we make not alone, but together with one another and with Christ. Itgs not a journey for some, but a journey for all, and each of us has a role, a particular responsibility, both in our preparations and on the journey itself. We may feel that our role and responsibility is difficult to discern, that we cange imagine what we could possibly do, but God has something in mind and, if we go to him in prayer, we will discover that something. It might seem insignificant, might well be surprising, but whatever it is, that something will be vital if we want to share in the victory that Christ has already won.

Change, as I have said in the past, is not easy and can certainly be painful, but I leave you with these words from the book, õ*For All That Has Been, Thanks*" by Rowan Williams and Joan Chittister:

ŏDivision of opinion, too often the fault line of human relationships, is, when we embrace it openly, what invigorates thinking and stirs new thought. It is the ground of new beginnings, the beginning of new insight, the foundation of new respect for the other......Creativity, it is too often forgotten, comes out of differences. It is the ability to function outside the lines, beyond the dots, despite the boxes and mental chains by which we have forever been constrained, that fits us to be the architects of the future. Instead, we want everyone to think alike when what we really need are people who are thinking newly – about theology, about God, about faith, about morality, about science, about life. "You won't find this year's birds in last year's nests," the proverb teaches, but we so easily miss the meaning of it entirely. Life is meant for moving on......."
